Sharing Challenges and Best Practices in Systems Integration

Police systems and data sources are increasingly need to be connected in order to enhance intelligence and increase efficiency. On the one hand, system integration and information exchange have not always been successful. On the other hand, collaboration across police forces and partner organisations improves rapidly and more and more information and systems need to be linked.

How does that work in practice? What best practices have been developed and can be shared with other police forces? In a workshop setting, we invite police officers, researchers and industry experts to share their experiences. We also aim to establish a more long-term knowledge exchange on the topic.

Learning from You

All participants are invited to give a short presentation (5-10 min) on their plans and best practices. What are the core issues? What has worked well or perhaps less so? What conditions, support activities and risk mitigation are needed to make system integration and information exchange work in a police context? What benefits can really be expected?

Learning from Research

The workshop is part of a larger research effort and we would like to share with you the results of our studies, such as a trend report on ICT for policing and the roles of mobile tools and social media.

Learning from Industry

Selected experts will talk about the latest approach and technology. What is being developed? What back-end technology is needed in terms of infrastructure and information management? What about legal issues, privacy and culture?

Who can Participate?

The workshop will be held in English and is intended for police officers of all ranks from European police forces who either (a) have experience in and can report on system integration and information exchange, or (b) would like to present their challenges and ask questions.

What does it cost?

The workshop and accommodation costs €100 for police officers. This includes workshop participation, airport transfer, an invited welcome dinner, breakfast and lunch. The workshop is co-sponsored by the European research project COMPOSITE. Participants need to cover their own travel expenses.
